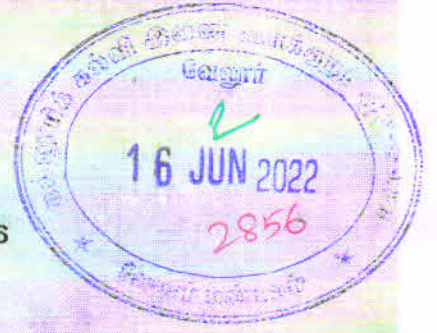

Sir / Madam,

Sub: Higher Education Department – Rule of Reservation Policy of the State of Tamil Nadu - Admissions to UG / PG programs in Colleges / State Universities – Strict adherence of – Instructions issued – Reg.

All admissions to under-graduate and post-graduate programs in the Colleges and all the State Universities under the aegis of the Higher Education Department in the State of Tamil Nadu is being made purely on the basis of merit, applying the rule of reservation followed by the Government of Tamil Nadu, which is as follows:-

- (i) 31% for Open Competition (OC)
- (ii) 26.5% for Backward Classes (BC) other than BC Muslims and 3.5% for Backward Classes Muslims.
- (iii) 20% for Most Backward Classes (MBC) and Denotified Communities (DNC).
- (iv) 15% for Scheduled Castes (SC) and 3% for SCA.
- (v) 1% for Scheduled Tribes (ST).

2. An important point that needs to be emphasized is that while filling up seats under Open Competition (OC), irrespective of the community of the student, merit alone needs to be considered and students should be admitted, accordingly. All the Colleges / State Universities are directed to scrupulously follow the Rule of Reservation of the State of Tamil Nadu while doing admissions for the UG / PG programs in the Colleges / State Universities including post-graduate programs in Biotechnology and such other courses, even if they are funded by external agencies such as DBT, DST etc and to reallocate the unfilled seats under reserved seats as follows :-

"The unfilled SC / ST vacancies can be filled by MBC / DNC candidates. Unfilled MBC / DNC seats can be filled by BC candidates as well as unfilled BC vacancies can be filled by other communities. Unfilled Muslim BC vacancies can be filled by other BC. The unfilled ST vacancies shall be filled up by SC and if there is no SC they shall be filled up from DNC / MBC".
